THE PERCH MASTER SUITE

The premium luxury suite is the entire top floor of the house. The suite features a queen-size canopy style bed, large sitting area complete with fireplace, television, VCR, and mini-fridge. The *en suite* bathroom features granite surfaces, whirlpool tub, separate shower, sauna room, toilet and dressing room. All rooms have stunning picture-window views of the water and islands below.



THE NEST FAMILY SUITE

The Family Suite comprises a large main suite with queen-size bed, sofa, television, VCR, and mini-fridge and an adjoining room with twin beds. The main suite has an *en suite* bathroom and walk-in closet. Ocean views from both bedrooms.

SPORT

For the sport enthusiast, the Sunshine Coast and nearby Vancouver have many opportunities.

There are several golf courses within a short driving distance from Eagle's Perch. Hiking, biking, and walking are all activities that need little equipment for you to thoroughly enjoy.

In Vancouver, there are great opportunities to catch sporting events. The National Hockey League's Vancouver Canucks play at the state-of-the-art General Motors Place; nearby, at BC Place, the BC Lions play in the Canadian Football League. The Vancouver Ravens play in the National Lacrosse League. Lacrosse is Canada's national sport, despite the love affair with hockey! And, the Vancouver Whitecaps are the city's soccer (football) team.

Sporting action is not limited to spectators: hike or bike the "seawall", or climb the Grouse Grind, a rigorous 2.9 km (1.8 mile) hike that takes you straight up the face of Grouse Mountain, the "peak of Vancouver."

HISTORIC & CULTURAL VANCOUVER

Vancouver's attractions include historic Gastown, with its cobble-stone streets, many shops, and lively street entertainment. Chinatown, North America's third largest, is a great place to browse the local shops and markets. In Chinatown, see the Yat-Sen Garden, an exquisite reproduction of a Ming Dynasty landscape. The Museum of Anthropology, located at the University of British Columbia, is a great place to learn about aboriginal culture.

The Queen Elizabeth Theater, the Orpheum, and the Centre in Vancouver for Performing Arts all offer first-rate theatre.

During August, fireworks light the sky for two Wednesday and Saturday evenings for the annual Celebration of Light.

NATURAL VANCOUVER

Highlights include world-famous Stanley Park. Mostly forested, the park extends to the very tip of the city's peninsula to the narrows, the entrance to Burrard Inlet. The park includes the Vancouver Aquarium, several beaches, a public swimming pool, totem poles, a cricket oval, and a 10 km (6 mile) "seawall" which circumnavigates the park—a great place to bike, walk or blade. You may hire bicycles on nearby Denman Street.

Queen Elizabeth Park, located in the centre of the city, includes fabulous gardens and a biosphere. There are tremendous views of the city and the Coastal Mountains from the park.

ART & GARDEN TOURS

IN GIBSONS LANDING , VANCOUVER, & THE SUNSHINE COAST

Eagle's Perch is located in Gibsons Landing, just a short ferry ride from Vancouver. Gibsons Landing is well positioned to have easy access to the Lower Mainland, Sunshine Coast and Howe Sound areas.

GOLFING

The Sunshine Coast offers three different golf courses designed at various levels.

Sunshine Coast Golf & Country Club offers 18 holes laid out amid stunning beauty. Nearby, the Sechelt Golf & Country Club is located on a plateau overlooking the town below. Further north, the Pender Harbour Golf Club Society is a 9-hole course carved from the Pacific dense forest.

WATER ACTIVITIES

There are excellent opportunities at your doorstep to enjoy the waters of British Columbia and the Sunshine Coast. Sea kayaking, sailing, canoeing, swimming and fishing are all available from Gibsons Landing. Other activities, such as cold water diving and windsurfing, can be accessed further along the Sunshine Coast. Whitewater rafting is available from Whistler.

REGIONAL DAY TRIPS

Gibsons is an excellent location to visit all points on the Sunshine Coast. Alternatively, a 50 minute ferry takes you to the Lower Mainland with its shopping and recreational facilities. Whistler is only 90 minutes drive from the Horseshoe Bay ferry terminal. Just before and beyond Whistler are many provincial parks including Shannon Falls, Garibaldi, and Nairn Falls.

WINTER ACTIVITIES

Gibsons Landing is located near the Langdale ferry terminal, and after a 45 minute ferry ride, is only minutes from Vancouver's three "local" mountains. The North Shore mountains of Cypress, Grouse and Seymour all offer close, reasonably priced skiing. For those who don't ski downhill, there are cross country routes, inner-tube tobogganing, snowshoeing, ice skating and sleigh rides.

CYCLING & MOUNTAIN BIKING

The Sunshine Coast offers the visitor some great cycling and mountain biking. Day trips are offered to suit your fitness level, from beginner to expert. These guided tours will introduce you to the area by exploring logging roads, paved roads and biking trails.

Vancouver offers excellent biking opportunities. Try biking the "seawall" or take a mountain bike up one of the local North Shore mountains.

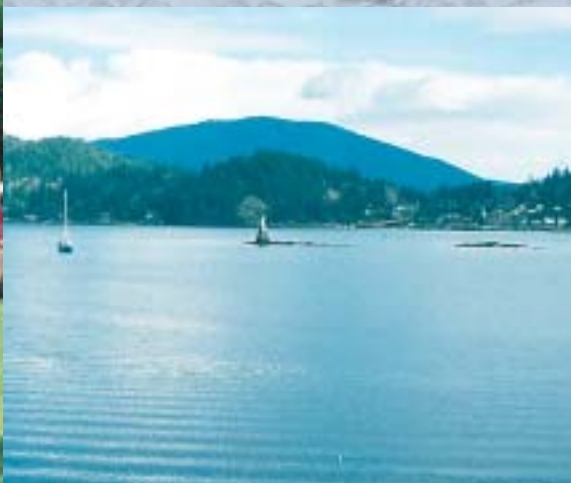
RISTOL ABORIGINAL CULTURE/NATURE TOUR

Our Cultural Guides are representative of all Canada's Aboriginal peoples and will share their historical perspective with you. You will be hosted by Cultural Guides at the start of the trip at Moccasin Valley Marina. You will be taken by bus to beautiful Sakinaw Lake, paddle a 9.5 metre Coureurs-de-Bois canoe and learn the history of the aboriginal people. At the end of Sakinaw Lake, there is a short hike along a creekside trail to an ocean beach.

After lunch, climb aboard the Ocean War Canoe and paddle through mild waves up Agamemnon Channel to Ristol Eco-Tours Base.

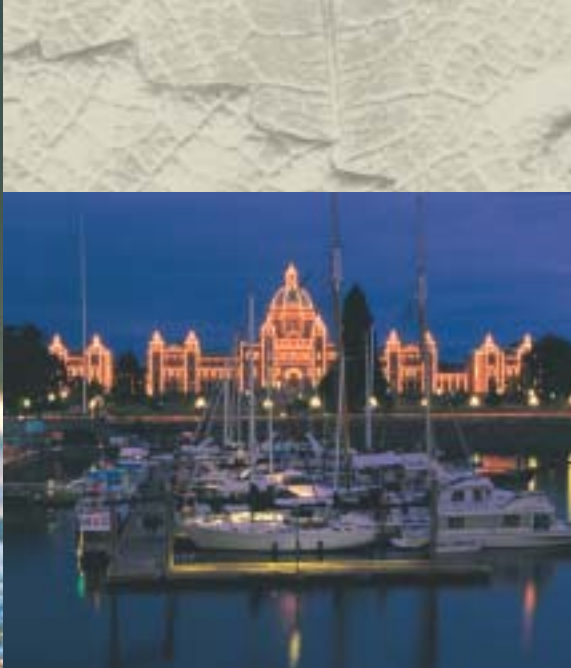

SPORTING LIFE

All sorts of water-based activities are available from the Oceanside area. Sea kayaking, canoeing, water skiing, swimming, fishing, marine tours and whale watching are all popular activities.

During the winter months, skiing is available only a short drive from Bowser at Mount Washington. Skiing, cross country skiing, snow boarding, and other winter activities are all available.

ART & CULTURE

Vancouver Island is home to some of Canada's most famous and well respected artists. A number of studios and galleries representing various artists and art styles, such as painting, weaving, carving, pottery, and First Nations art are found along the coastal highway.

In many of the island's communities, art galleries and shops contribute to the history and culture of the local area. Whether you want to learn about history, culture, or would just like to go shopping, the galleries of Vancouver Island have a lot to offer.

VICTORIA

A pleasant 2½ hour drive, Victoria, the capital of British Columbia, makes a great day trip. Enjoy the city's sights including the BC Legislature, the stately Empress Hotel and the charming harbour. Government Street offers great shopping, and the city's Chinatown is delightful. Garden enthusiasts will enjoy the city's many gardens and parks, including the garden at Government House and the world famous Butchart Gardens.

REGIONAL DAY TRIPS

Bowser's location mid-island on Vancouver Island makes it the perfect base. Qualicum Beach, Nanaimo, Campbell River, Tofino, Long Beach, and Victoria are all easy driving distance.

Take in one (or more) of the many Gulf Islands that dot the Canadian coast. Located between the mainland and Vancouver Island are 200 islands which form the Gulf Islands.

The Northern Gulf Islands include Denman, Hornby and Quadra islands. Ferry service to Denman and Hornby islands is from nearby Buckley Bay, while Quadra is accessed from Campbell River.

The Southern Gulf Islands include Salt Spring, Galiano, Saturna and Pender islands. All Southern Gulf Islands are accessed from the Swartz Bay ferry terminal, about a 2 hour drive from Imagine Beach Getaway.

WILDLIFE & NATURE ADVENTURES

Nature abounds on Vancouver Island. A trip to Tofino for whale watching is well worth the drive. Long Beach is a must see. It's a great place to experience wild Pacific storms during the winter months. Look for wildlife in their natural habitat; you may see deer, bears, eagles, sea lions, and whales!

Nature also abounds at Bowser. Imagine Beach's location mid-island makes all that is natural more accessible.

The Cathedral Grove includes several specimen of trees that are 600 to 800 years old. A forest walk winds through the grove past specimens up to 75 m (245 feet) in height and with trunks up to 3 m (10 feet) across.

Pacific Rim National Park on the west coast of Vancouver Island is a pleasant drive from Bowser. The park is famous for its long, sandy beaches, moss- and fern-covered rainforest and various hiking and nature trails. The Wickaninnish Centre is well worth visiting for its informative and interactive displays.

ABOUT THE NICOLA VALLEY

In the scenic Nicola Valley the sun shines nearly every day on the grasslands and rolling hills. The area gets less than 254 mm (10 inches) of rain annually and the hottest summer days can hit above 30C (90F), and drop to -1C (30F) overnight. There are over 2047 hours of annual sunshine in the Nicola Valley, so there's a good chance you'll have a sunny day or two!

From arts to outdoor recreation, from world-renowned events to small town friendliness, the charm of the Nicola Valley must be experienced to be believed.

WILDLIFE & NATURE

From wild flowers to wildlife, the common lands and area adjoining the lakeshore property is inhabited by deer, moose, coyote, eagle, and black bear, with opportunities for viewing and photography as you enjoy the beauty of the region.

HIKING, BIKING & HORSE RIDING

The rolling hills offer great opportunities for hiking, biking and enjoying the natural beauty of the landscape. Horses are available within walking distance of the lodge. Cowboy cookouts and Chuck Wagon rides are available. Mountain bikes are available at the lodge.

Ice fishing and skating on the lake just outside the lodge are popular winter activities along with skiing at the Sun Peaks Resort. Snow-Shoeing and snowmobiling afford guests the opportunity to explore the network of area trails in the rolling hills of the Upper Nicola Valley.

ABOUT THE CARIBOO REGION

The Cariboo/Chilcotin region are known for its generally dry, continental climate with precipitation ranging from 42-62 cm (16-24 inches) per year. Lac la Hache is 808 m (2,650 feet) above sea level and the warm summers and cold winters ensure vacationers experience the best of the four seasons. In summer, guests should take their bathing suits, sun glasses, and sunscreen, plus cameras and lots of film. Winter clothing for ice fishing or snow activities is necessary during the winter months.

FISHING

Although the Cariboo region is known for its hundreds of many great fishing lakes, Lac la Hache Cabin guests need go no further than the lodge's dock and boat to enjoy some of the best fishing in British Columbia, including renowned for its Kokanee salmon. Rainbow and lake trout are plentiful and char and brook round out the native species. The lake is 20 km (12 miles) long with a mean depth of 14.6 m (48 feet) and a maximum depth of 37.2 m (122 feet.)

The lake boasts of lake trout up to 14 kg (30 pounds) and Kokanee salmon averaging from 450-680 g (1 to 1½ pounds.) Rainbow are known to exceed Kokanee in size. Ice fishing is very popular during the winter months. While on the water you will enjoy the beauty of the rolling hills, forests and greasslands along the western shore and the small forested islands dotting the lake.

WATER SPORTS

The lake beach, lodge dock and boats are available for fishing and guest enjoyment. Swim in the warm waters or sun on the dock. Kayakers and canoers enjoy the lake along with fishers and swimmers. River rafting is also well known in the region.

WINTER SPORTS

The year round recreational region provides cross country ski enthusiasts with some of the world's best trails. Each year, during the first week of February, over 1000 cross country skiers enter the 50 km (31 miles) Cariboo Marathon. Bowling, curling and skating round out winter recreation.

Activities in the autumn and winter include skating, snowmobiling, ice fishing, hunting and cross country skiing on some of the top trails in British Columbia. Our accommodations are located at the base of Mount Timothy Ski Resort which offers some of the finest family skiing in British Columbia. The mountain lies in a snow belt area that enjoys sunny skies and warm temperatures, providing skiers with pleasant days and fine conditions.

HIKING, BIKING & HORESBACK RIDING

Mountain bikes are provided for guest enjoyment and the rolling hills and valleys abound with opportunities for hiking, biking and viewing nature and wildlife.

GOLFING

The area has a number of golf courses to challenge enthusiasts and round out your vacation activities including an 18-hole PGA rated course at 108 Mile House Golf & Country Club.

LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

There is lots to do in the area, however locals suggest that vacationers enjoy a picnic and waterfall at Centennial Park, reputed to be one of the prettiest spots anywhere! You also must visit the original BX Stagecoach in 100 Mile House.
